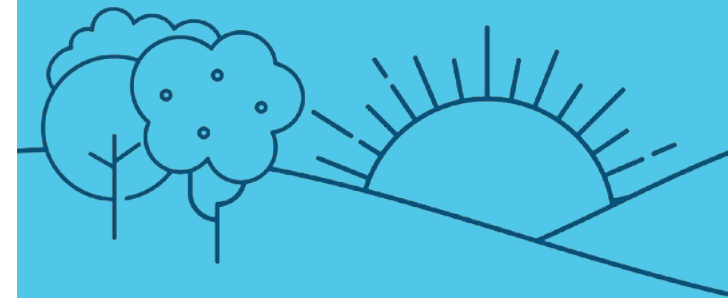

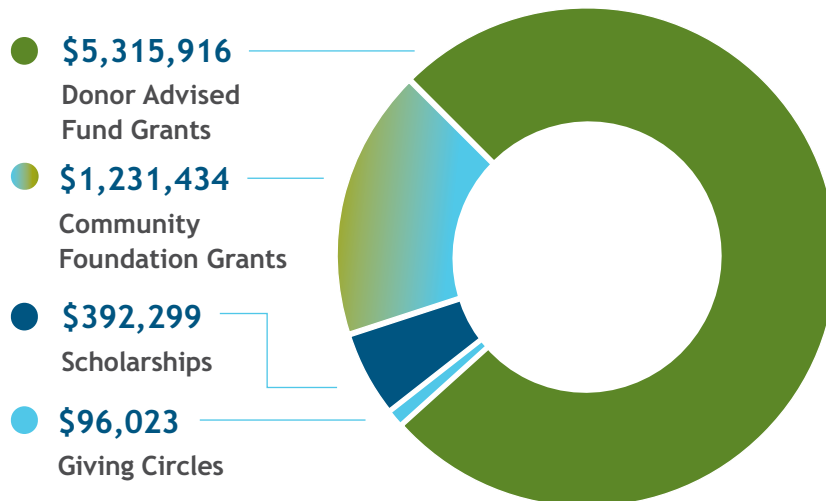

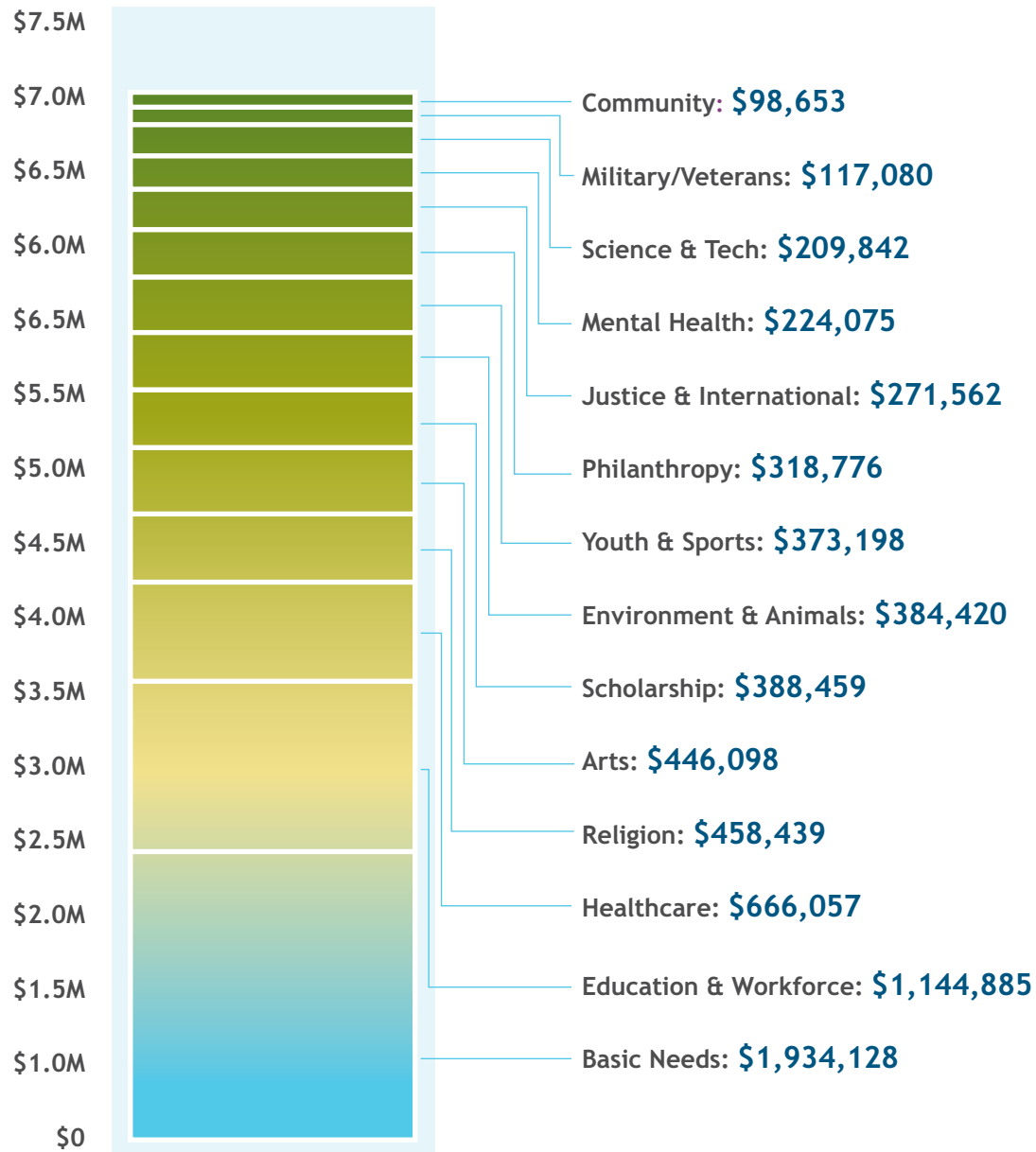

AT THE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

This year, the Community Foundation for Northern Virginia's board and staff developed a new five-year strategic plan with input from members of our greater community to serve as an inspiration and road map for the organization's work and impact in the coming years.

2023-2027 STRATEGIC PLAN

The Community Foundation adopted a new mission statement to advance equity across the region by unleashing the power of philanthropy and community leadership.

The plan is structured around four overarching pillars to guide our grantmaking, fundraising, and community leadership efforts:



Our focus on these four pillars will help us address root causes of economic and social inequities across our region. Income, race, ethnicity, and class divisions continue to create disparate social, economic, and health outcomes for Northern Virginians. Guided by this framework, the Community Foundation will be better positioned to help our community define, and then act on, the biggest challenges we face and the greatest opportunities we have to tackle inequitable systems.

We do nothing alone at the Community Foundation. The path forward means working in partnership with other like-minded institutions of renewal. Aligned with a common vision, we can grow and nurture trust across our divisions, invest in powerful programs, ideas, and solutions, and strengthen the ties that bind us to each other and to this place we all call home.

WE ADDRESS AND
SUPPORT ACCESS TO

mental health care for all

Although the COVID-19 pandemic began to wane in 2022, two years of related uncertainty and anxiety have taken their toll on our mental health, exacerbating and accelerating trends seen before 2019. The Community Foundation therefore spent the entire year focused on the issue with an emphasis on addressing and supporting access to mental health care for all. Our work corresponded with the national rollout of the 988 number, to help address the national crisis.



During 2022, the Community Foundation:

- Raised \$121,000 to build the first permanent fund dedicated to the mental health needs of Northern Virginians,
- Convened 17 regional partners to seek shared solutions and help build awareness and training resources across the region,
- Presented key findings and highlights from *Finding our Way Back to Mental Health* to several regional and Commonwealth-wide audiences,
- Held mental health trainings for Community Foundation staff and regional partners to increase awareness and pathways to effective treatment.



MENTAL HEALTH

In March of 2022, Insight Region®, the Community Foundation’s center for community research, launched *Finding our Way Back to Mental Health: The Need for Accessible, Affordable Treatment Amidst Collective Trauma* at our annual Shape of the Region Conference. The report shared some stark and pressing statistics. For example, in 2019, 8 percent of all adults in Northern Virginia reported active symptoms of anxiety and/or depression. In fall of 2021, that rate was 28 percent, a nearly four-fold increase representing 550,000 adults. An additional 200,000 adult residents were asymptomatic consumers of mental health services who were receiving (or who want to receive) medication or talk therapy. All told, more than 750,000 adults in Northern Virginia (39 percent of population) were experiencing mental health needs.

Our focus and work during 2022 on mental health resulted in the development by the Virginia Funders Collaborative of a mental health working group led by the Path Foundation. The Collaborative is building resources to improve access to mental health resources for pediatricians, nurses, and other medical staff across the Commonwealth. Mark Constantine, President and CEO of the Richmond Memorial Health Foundation, credits our work for focusing philanthropy on the issue, saying “This would not be happening but for the Community Foundation for Northern Virginia.”

Navid Rashid, one of the panelists at Shape of the Region, discussed the gaps in even well-intentioned funding, saying “if all you fund is crisis response, all you’ll serve are people in crises,” highlighting the need for targeting and tailoring funding, and an “all-levels, all-community” approach to mental healthcare access.

The Community Foundation will continue to support better access to mental health services through these partnerships and investments in the coming years.

Insight Region®

Insight Region® is the Community Foundation's center for community research and a hub for reliable, well-researched, and actionable data and analyses on issues critical to Northern Virginia. Through this work we seek to inform charitable giving, inspire action, and foster a more inclusive and prosperous region.

In addition to the report on mental health, Insight Region® also launched *Ready for Kindergarten, Ready for Life* in October of 2021 and subsequently presented the data to audiences in the government, private, and public sectors throughout the year.

The causes and consequences of Northern Virginia's preschool enrollment disparity

Northern Virginia's children at or near poverty have the second lowest rate of preschool enrollment in the country; just 29 percent of three- and four-year-olds in this income bracket are in school. It also has the largest gap in enrollment rates between these children and their counterparts in higher-income families.

High-quality preschool has the potential to narrow long-standing racial and economic opportunity gaps, provide crucial relief to Northern Virginia's working parents, and produce stunning long-term returns on investment. While all children benefit from the experience, children from families with limited economic means stand to benefit the most.

The brief explores how location, cost, and demand explain the region's low rate of preschool enrollment among its most financially vulnerable children and concludes with a series of recommendations.





Shape of the Region Conference

Finding our Way Back to Mental Health: Designing a more accessible, equitable system in Northern Virginia

March 15, 2022

The Community Foundation's fifth annual Shape of the Region Conference was held on March 15, 2022. This convening highlighted the complex barriers to basic mental health service, such as therapy, helpful medications, and others, through a presentation of Insight Region's report, *Finding our Way Back to Mental Health*. Over 300 people attended the event from a cross-section of local residents, including nonprofit and foundation employees, social changemakers, private sector businesses, and representatives from state, local, and national governments. The conference also discussed what innovative ideas and opportunities may exist to address this critical issue that impacts us all.

The Community Foundation's 2021 Raise the Region Gala was hosted virtually by Leon Harris of NBC4 on Friday, October 8, 2021. Business, philanthropic, and community leaders joined from their own homes across the region and in small "pod parties" to take part in this live-streamed event.

The theme this year was "Building a Community that Works for Everyone" and highlighted the Community Foundation's efforts to promote an inclusive prosperity throughout the region, reflective of the region's diversity.

The Community Foundation awarded the 2021 Community Leadership Award that evening to Karen G. Schaufeld, presented annually for outstanding community service and dedication to improving the quality of life for all Northern Virginians.

Karen is a philanthropist, author, entrepreneur, and lawyer. She is the founder and President of 100WomenStrong, a grantmaking organization that invests in Loudoun County, Virginia. She co-founded All Ages Read Together (AART), a school readiness program for preschool-aged children in low-income households, and currently serves as the CEO of SWaN Hill Top working to redevelop Hill Top House Hotel in historic Harpers Ferry, West Virginia. Karen is the CEO and co-founder of Altor Locks, a company that creates innovative security products like bike locks and trailer hitch locks. As the founder of PoweredbyFacts.com and VaOurWay, Karen is a citizen advocate for the growth of renewable energy across the Commonwealth. She also serves on many regional advisory councils and board of directors, and has published books for children.

Afghan Relief and Resettlement Fund for Northern Virginia

The Community Foundation established the Afghan Relief and Resettlement Fund for Northern Virginia on September 1, 2021 to support Afghans fleeing their country who either pass through or resettle here in Northern Virginia. To date, more than 4,000 refugees have resettled in the area.

First round grants from the Fund focused on immediate unmet basic human needs such as food, shelter, acute health, and acute mental health services. Subsequent grants supported longer term resettlement efforts, addressing refugees' needs for legal, mental health, physical health, housing, transportation, education, language, and other services, with a total of \$270,990 awarded throughout the year.

No fee was charged by the Community Foundation on Fund assets, assuring that all contributions received from generous individuals and businesses throughout the region supported resettlement agencies and other nonprofits that were optimally positioned to provide immediate assistance and longer-term aid and support.

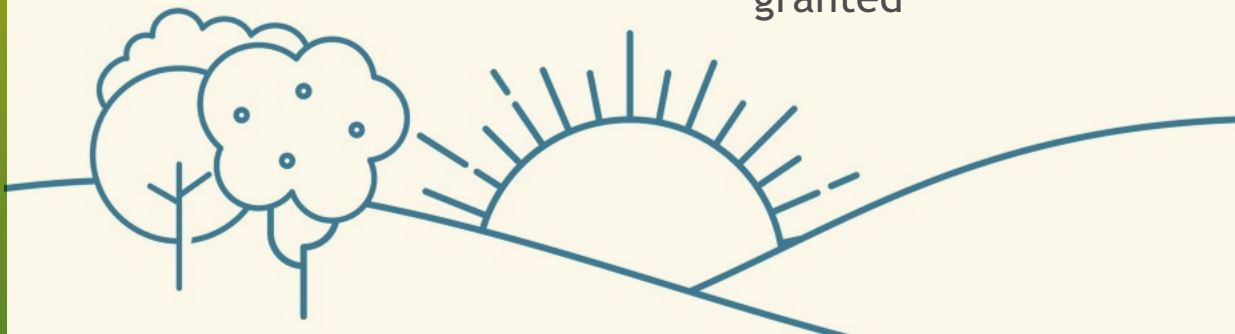
